Guidelines regarding the use of rapid tests in elementary and secondary schools in addition to the testing that is currently available

Tests: It is suggested to immediately test the contacts at school of a person with COVID 19, using PCR gargle tests.

Rapid antigen tests: It is suggested to use rapid antigen tests along with the other measures if students show symptoms at school.

- A. If the test is negative, students can return to class with a mask (in areas of concern, the mask must be worn until symptoms resolve).
- B. If the test is positive, have the student take a PCR test to confirm, either a gargle test on-site or at a testing clinic. The student must self-isolate until the results are received.

Guide de mesures pour la gestion des cas et des contacts: It is suggested to modify the self-isolation period for contacts by testing them on days 3 to 5 and on day 7. If the test is still negative on day 7, self-isolation can end.
