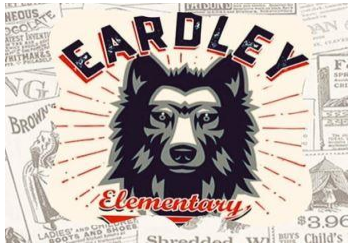
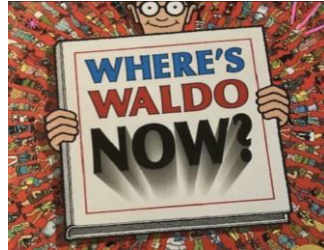

### The Halloween Dance

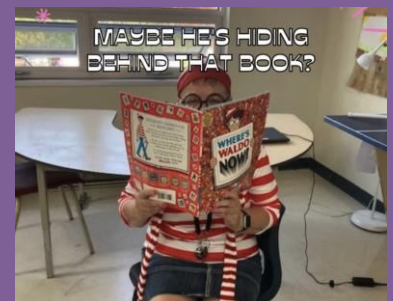

The next time you see these ladies, thank them for being our gym teachers and coaches.

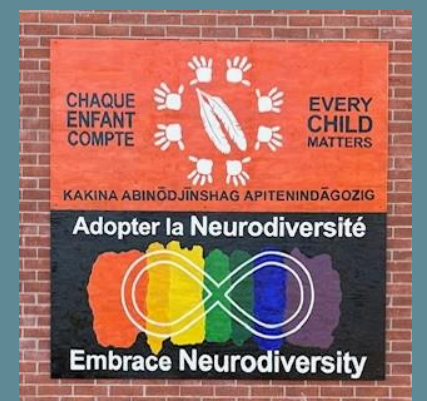
### Everyone Welcome

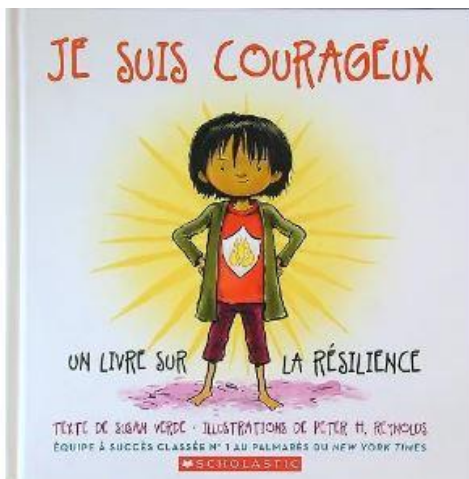
taking it out.

## Je Suis Courageux

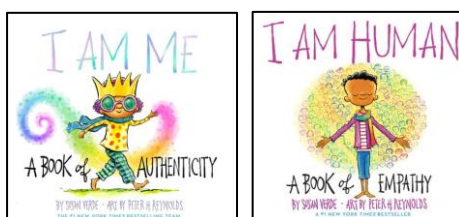
